## Introduction

SJIPH was established through a state grant to the Rowan University /
Rutgers- Camden Board of Governors to integrate the region's medical,
educational, research and community assets for the benefit of residents in
southern New Jersey

- Main goals:
  - Improve health and health outcomes in Southern New Jersey
  - Focus on population health, population medicine, public health approaches
  - Engage with the community/community stakeholders

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# LOI Focus Areas

Projects DO NOT need to identify *ALL* academic or community partners at the LOI stage.

The Sandbox Meeting will provide opportunities for collaboration and refining the project idea.

## CENTRAL RESEARCH QUESTION

Does the research question align with goals of RFP in terms of health impact?

## PROJECTED IMPACT ON HEALTH

Does the project promise to improve health determinants and health outcomes in South Jersey?

## COLLABORATIVE RESEARCH TEAM

How strong it the academic-community partnership?

#### **BUDGET AND FEASIBILITY**

Is the project feasible within the constraints of the proposed budget?

### CAPACITY BUILDING AND SUSTAINABILITY

Does the partnership promise to remain stable and build community capacity over time?

# Review Process

Highest scoring projects will be invited to the Sandbox meeting on October 10th.



All LOIs are reviewed by SJIPH and submitted to reviewers

Reviewer team:

- Faculty from Rowan University,
- Faculty from Rutgers-Camden,
- Community stakeholders

Scoring Categories/criteria (5-point scale):

- Research Idea
- Collaborative Team
- Impact (i.e.in the region, community, scholarly)
- Sustainability
- Budget & Feasibility

## Two funding tracks

#### **Funding for cycle 4 will consist of two distinct tracks:**

- Track 1 Catalyst grants
  - Catalyst grants include projects funded up to \$25,000. All project teams are eligible for Track 1 funding (18 months duration)
- **Track 2 Signature grants**

Signature grants include larger projects funded between \$50,000 - \$100,000. Project teams should be well established, showing a record of successful collaboration and completion of prior research. (24 month duration)

SJIPH will fund a combination of catalyst and signature grants based on their quality and projected impact on health or health determinants.

## **Questions: Sandbox Meeting**

#### What is the Sandbox meeting?

The Sandbox Meeting is for LOIs that have been selected by reviewers to advance to the next stage. The Sandbox event will provide a collaborative environment where partnership teams and research facilitators will expand upon the LOI by refining research objectives and developing an outline for a full research proposal

#### Who is required to attend and will it be in-person?

Every selected project must be represented at the Sandbox meeting by at least 1 academic partner (Rowan/ Rutgers-Camden) and 1 community partner. The event will be in-person on October 10th at the Joint Health Sciences Center.
